



Birds Of Slovakia

From the Tatras to the eastern plains



ORAVA


This large area of hills and mountains with broad open valleys is located only one and a half hours south of Krakow and comprises a nice variety of habitats. Besides the high mountains there are many peat bogs in Orava, as well as rocky areas and old forests with woodpeckers and owls.

LIPTOV

Similarly to Orava there is a large artificial lake in the middle of Liptov basin. It is reputedly the most beautiful region of the country with a ring of mountains all around and pastures at their foothills. EAST SLOVAKIA

Largely flat country surrounded by low hills covered with beech and oak forests. Latorica marshes and Senne ponds are important wetlands. Other habitats include puszta grassland, limestone quarries with Eagle Owls, fields, windbreaks and sand dunes with Bee-eater colonies.









Slovakia is among the longest established birdwatching destinations in Eastern Europe. All Europe's woodpeckers have populations of over 1000 pairs each while owls breed in hundreds of pairs each. The extensive Carpathian mountains offer a fascinating range of forest birds while the plains in the east have little known wetlands and dry areas with Beeeaters. This tour combines the best examples of habitats ranging from mountain forests and hills to large flat areas with marshes, sand dunes, quarries and fields. Both hotels are set by large artificial lakes with rich littoral vegetation that provide a great habitat for many songbirds. Our local guides have more than twenty years experience of accompanying groups and they help to run the itinerary in the best possible way.

We use a newly remodelled 3 star hotel in the north of the area close to the Black Grouse leks. Plenty of birds can be seen right outside the small village. **Hotel in Liptov region**

There are 2 hotels that suit us best in this area, both near Liptovska Mara reservoir. Vicinity of the lake ensures that we will have good birding opportunities. **Hotel in the east Slovakia**

is found in the middle of a small town amidst plains not far from Ukraine and Hungary. Many different habitats are found nearby incl. oxbows with heronries.
